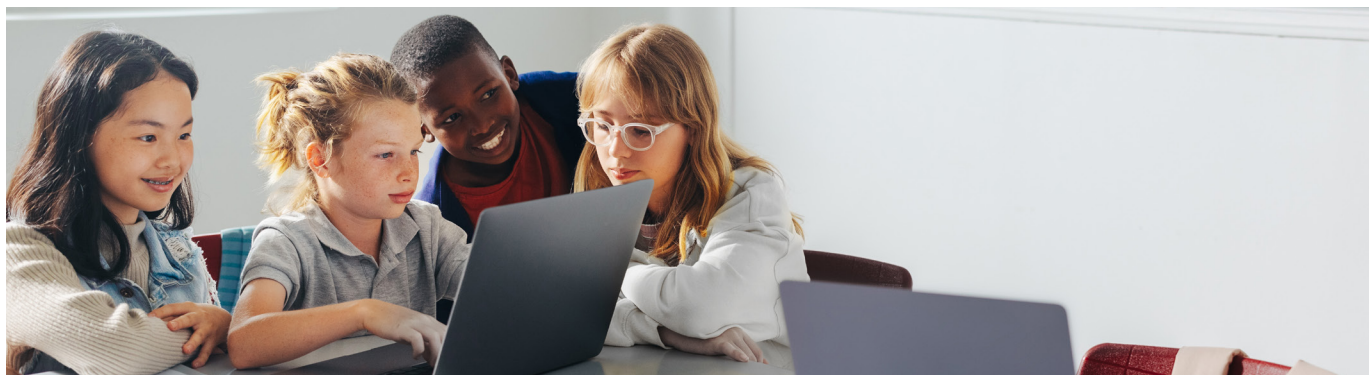


# THE FRONTIER E-RATE TOOLKIT

## E-Rate at a Glance

### More Opportunity For All

For schools and libraries facing funding gaps, E-Rate is the key that unlocks affordable devices for all. For more than 25 years, Frontier has been a trusted E-Rate provider, helping organizations secure the funding and connectivity they need to communicate, educate and inspire. ### About E-Rate

The Schools and Libraries Program, more commonly known as E-Rate, is a federally funded program established in 1998 that provides discounts on Internet access and managed internal connections for eligible schools and libraries. Service discounts can range from 20% to 90%.

### Administration

E-Rate is administered by the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) under the direction of the Federal Communications Commission (FCC).

### Eligibility



#### Schools

- Must operate as a nonprofit business
- Must provide K-12 education, not college
- Includes Head Start, Pre-K, Juvenile Justice and Special Education
- Cannot have grants exceeding \$50 million
- Includes support facilities for school use only
- Includes consortia of schools



#### Libraries

- Must operate as a nonprofit business
- Budget must be separate from any school budget
- Includes support facilities for library use only
- Cannot gain assistance from state library agency via Library Services & Technology Act
- Includes consortia of libraries

## Eligible Services List

Each year, the FCC releases the Eligible Services List (ESL) for the upcoming funding year. The list includes a description of the products and services that are eligible for E-Rate discounts and is divided into two categories of service:



### Category One

- Data transmissions services and/or Internet access



### Category Two

- Internal connections
- Managed Dedicated Internet or Managed Wi-Fi
- Basic maintenance of internal connections

The full Eligible Services List is available on [usac.org](https://www.usac.fcc.gov). The list is updated each year by the FCC before the Form 471 application filing window opens.



## Application Process

All funding applicants need to follow these six steps:

1. Open competitive bidding for desired services (**Form 470**)
2. Select service providers
3. Apply for discounts (**Form 471**)
4. Undergo application review
5. Start services (**Form 486**)
6. Two options for invoicing: BEAR for reimbursement or SPI for provider discounted invoicing (**Form 472 or Form 474**)

## Choosing Your Internet Service Provider

To find a service provider, applicants for E-Rate funding must open a competitive bidding process by posting a Form 470 through the USAC website's E-Rate Productivity Center. Applicants then receive and evaluate bids from service providers.

**How is the E-Rate program funded?** E-Rate is funded through the Universal Service Fund (USF). The E-Rate program is administered by the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) and overseen by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC).



**Is my organization eligible for E-Rate funding?** Public and private K-12 schools and nonprofit public libraries are eligible for E-Rate discounts. Not sure if your institution qualifies? A full list of eligibility requirements is available **on the [E-Rate website](#)**.



**What kind of discount can my organization get through E-Rate?** E-Rate reimburses up to 90% of eligible technology expenses. Frontier customers see an average of 76%\* savings on connectivity services.



**Can my current service provider be my E-Rate partner?** Yes. If you currently receive service, you can ask your provider to submit a bid in response to your FCC Form 470. If your current service provider is Frontier, get in touch!



**How do I apply for E-Rate funding?**

1. Create an account with USAC's **[E-Rate Productivity Center \(EPC\)](#)**. This is the management portal for the E-Rate Program.
2. File FCC Form 470 through the EPC to begin the bidding process.
3. For more details on the **[application process](#)**, refer to the USAC website.



**How do I choose a service provider?** To apply for E-Rate funding, applicants must conduct a fair and open competitive bidding process. The bidding period must be open for at least 28 days. Once the bidding process is closed, applicants may evaluate the bids and select their service provider.



**What services are eligible for E-Rate funding?** Internet access and related equipment are eligible for E-Rate discounts. Eligible products or services must be used for educational purposes. **[A full list of eligible services](#)** is updated each year on the USAC website.

## E-Rate for Education

### IMPORTANT REMINDERS: E-Rate at a Glance

As learning increasingly moves online, access to the internet is more critical than ever to student success. Not every school has the budget to secure the connectivity students need. That's where E-Rate comes in. This federally funded program is designed to fill the technology funding gap by providing discounts on internet and telecommunications services.



#### **School eligibility requirements**

Before you go any further, confirm that your school is eligible for E-Rate funding. According to the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC), schools applying for E-Rate funding must meet the following requirements:

- Operate as a nonprofit business
- Provide K-12 education, not college
- Include Head Start, Pre-K, Juvenile Justice and Special Education
- Cannot have grants exceeding \$50 million
- Include support facilities for school use only
- Include consortia of schools



### How E-Rate can help

Here's just a small sampling of the products and services E-Rate funding can help you cover:

- Internet access (Managed Dedicated Internet, Dedicated Internet Access, Fiber Broadband and Managed Wi-Fi)
- Managed Security (including web filtering)
- Firewall services
- Routers and switches
- Wireless access points
- Hardware upkeep and repair
- Software upgrades and patches



### E-Rate by the numbers

- **1998** – Year the E-Rate program was established
- **20% to 90%** – Range of discounts E-Rate offers on eligible services
- **89%** – **active applicants as of FY 2024 with available Category 2 budget funds available.**
- **\$4.456** – **Funding cap for 2025**
- **95%** – of E-Rate applicants who say E-Rate funding is vital to their Internet connectivity goals, according to the 2023 E-Rate Trends Report by Funds for Learning

- **Follow all the guidelines** – Make sure you understand every step of the E-Rate application process. To receive funding, you must adhere to all government guidelines. Don't leave money on the table by skipping a step!
